Minutes September 14, 2017 Maple Lake Improvement District

Planning and Zoning:

The Preliminary Planned Unit Development for Backlot Development 2nd Common Interest Community requested by Kurt Larson was discussed and the Board did not see any problems with this request.

Old Business:

The Board discussed the Labor Day Car Show and Dance and felt that it was well attended and wanted to hire the same band for next year. The Board discussed the fireworks portion of the event and agreed that they were well received, but at this time more donations would be needed if we were to do the fireworks again next year. Bonnie was instructed to post something on the website requesting more donations

It was moved by L. Abel, second by B. Wavra to instruct Bonnie to book the Downtown Horns for 2018's event. Motion carried.

New Business:

Corey Hanson, Water Quality Director for the Red Lake Watershed District gave an update on the Clearwater River Watershed Restoration and Protection Project. This is a statewide MPCA project on the 10-year cycle using the years 2006-2015, to evaluate water conditions and take actions to restore and protect water quality. The Red Lake Watershed District is drafting the results for the Clearwater River Watershed to determine the condition of the water quality in this area.

Corey discussed the water quality on Maple Lake and handed out a Water Quality Assessment with results from their study. He said that Maple Lake is considered a "shallow lake" and the study found that Maple Lake meets the standards for the depth of the lake. The Board also does water testing three times per year and the results are posted on the website for RMB Laboratories at <u>https://www.rmbel.info/</u>.

It was moved by G. Radke, 2nd by R. Behm to adjourn the meeting at 8:10 pm. Motion carried.
